ALLEGATIONS:

Complainant says that co-workers are "stalking" them, and one is acting "angry" and suspicious and hostile towards reporting employee. Says that a co-worker glued a piece of county equipment to their desk. Also complained that co-workers were reporting complainant's minor rule transgressions to supervisors.

FINDINGS:

OPI interviewed complainant regarding claims. Found that the angry and resentful co-worker was due to past interactions between the employees. The allegation of stalking was unfounded, as the behavior complained of was the co-worker leaving whenever complainant was present, and attempting to avoid any interaction with them, which is not by any definition "stalking." OPI interviewed employee responsible for equipment. They said they examined equipment and did not find any indication it was glued in any way. Further said that the rubber feet on the equipment became tacky naturally, and stuck to the desk. OPI also advised complainant not to make any rule transgressions.
